

**Keystone Fish, Game & Forestry  
Protective Association**

**Persons who violate any club rule are subject to disciplinary action by the association.**

1. Individuals are responsible for their own property. The association assumes no responsibility for loss or damage to any item(s) or equipment.
2. Only members may hunt on club property. Guest may accompany a physically challenged member while hunting. However, guests shall not drive any game or carry any weapon on club property and must remain within 10ft of that member.
3. Persons participating on work parties, including volunteer help in the clubhouse may have a reasonable amount of food and beverage free. The person in charge of the work party will coordinate the requirements for food and beverage.
4. No one is allowed in the office other than officers without the responsible person's permission.
5. No one shall be allowed to remove from the premises any article belonging to the club without the permission of an officer or committee person.
6. Hats must be removed for the pledge of allegiance to the flag during the opening of a meeting.
7. A trustee, the president or vice president may obligate funds in emergency situations without prior approval of the association.
8. The treasurer can pay normal operating expenses for the club without membership approval.
9. The rental of the pig roaster of an individual will be \$50.00 plus repairs for one day use. The president will set nonprofit organization's cost.
10. Any person using dirty or profane language on club property will be reminded this is a family organization and may be referred to disciplinary action by written complaint of those offended.
11. Motorized vehicles shall not be operated on club grounds, except for maintenance activities by authorized workers. Normal access roads to the rifle and pistol ranges are open to the members using licensed vehicles. Physically challenged members may use vehicles within the limits of their permit issued by the Pa. Game Commission.
12. Members are encouraged to bring guests to the clubhouse. However, members are responsible for the conduct of such guest. There are no limitations on the number of visits by a specific guest, but one who is a frequent visitor should be approached to become a member.
13. Organized club activities shall have preference over any individual.
14. No loaded firearms in the clubhouse except on the firing line of the indoor range.
15. Camping will be in designated area only.
16. No littering on the club property.
17. Open fires are not allowed on club property, except in designated places by campers or organizations. During a fire ban there will be no fires allowed at all.
